The Democratic candidate did not respond. The following pages have responses from the Republican candidate.

1. Poverty. The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and other similar initiatives provide funding for millions of poor Americans who cannot afford to adequately feed themselves or their families. Congress should oppose restrictions on SNAP that prevent the most vulnerable from receiving these benefits.

Michelle	Talkington	With food prices continuing to rise, it is critical to ensure all Americans have food	
	(R)	security regardless of their financial status.	

2. Abortion. Congress should enact legislation permanently banning the use of taxpayer funding for abortion and banning abortion in federal healthcare facilities or from being performed by federal employees.

Michelle	Talkington	The Dobbs decision sent the issue of abortion back to the states, and as such the federal
	(R)	government should prevent the use of federal taxpayer funding for these procedures. I
		agree that federal healthcare facilities should no longer offer this measure with the
		exception of a life-or-death circumstance, not to be confused with a choice (financial,
		mental health, etc.), but one of an active emergencies requiring hospitalization.

3. Immigration. Congress should pass legislation to reform immigration policy to protect children and young people, such as the Protect Vulnerable Immigrant Youth Act, to provide humanitarian protection to abused, neglected or abandoned youth.

Michelle	Talkington	I would limit legislation to the protection of young people under the age of twenty
	(R)	years old, and be very specific about what constitutes neglect, abuse, and
		abandonment. Any immigration policy reform should ensure that cartels and traffickers
		are not incentivized, and that those children are carefully accounted for.

4. Education. Congress should enact legislation, such as the Educational Choice for Children Act, which empowers parents in every state with expanded educational options through federal tax credit incentives that will fund scholarships for K-12 students, including those attending Catholic schools.

Michelle Talk	ington I am in full support of school choice	e and parental rights. Education has suffered
(R)	drastically in the past years, and it	is critical that parents are supported with the
	resources and the legislative rights	that provide education that best suits their child.

5. Environment. Congress should pass legislation to encourage the responsible stewardship of the environment and its natural resources by protecting and promoting our national parks and wildlife preserves.

6. Family. Congress should enact legislation to support families, mothers and children, such as increasing and extending the child tax credit to include unborn children, extending the Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants and Children (WIC) and providing increased funding for childcare programs and foster programs.

Michelle	Talkington	I agree with much of this statement. Instead of increasing funding to childcare programs
	(R)	I would propose a solution that provides opportunities for employers and childcare
		provider subsidies that could offset the cost of care for working families. I will always
		support women, children, and families.

7. Conscience Protections. Congress should pass legislation to ensure religious freedom and rights of conscience for healthcare workers and other government employees.

Michelle	Talkington	The pandemic was a devastating blow to millions of Americans. No one should ever be
	(R)	put in the position to compromise their religious belief, or bodies for a medical
		mandate that stood in opposition to many in the medical field. We must fight to ensure
		this does not happen again, and that should extend to government employees.

8. Why should Catholics vote for me?

Michelle	Talkington	My Christian faith serves as the guiding compass for my decisions. There should be a
	(R)	balance between what is ethical and moral when creating legislation that affects
		millions. It is time to elect new leaders who are not easily compromised and elect those who have not become career politicians by sacrificing their faith and morality. I believe I
		am a strong candidate who will stand alongside others of faith to bring our nation back
		to the core values our founding fathers envisioned.
